

*PROCESSIONAL GOSPEL

Luke 19:28-40

P: The holy gospel according to Saint Luke, the nineteenth chapter.

C: Glory to you, O Lord.

²⁸After he had said this, [Jesus] went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem.
²⁹When he had come near Bethphage and Bethany, at the place called the

Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, ³⁰saying, "Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. ³¹If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it.'" ³²So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. ³³As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them, "Why are you untying the colt?" ³⁴They said, "The Lord needs it." ³⁵Then they brought it to Jesus; and after throwing their cloaks on the colt, they set Jesus on it. ³⁶As he rode along, people kept spreading their cloaks on the road. ³⁷As he was now approaching the path


in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord,

Abide with all who are in jails, detention centers, or prisons. Console all who experience times of trial or suffering, especially those on our prayer list and those we name in our hearts. God, in your mercy,

C: receive our prayer.

P: Give strength to those who will lead worship during Holy Week: pastors and deacons, altar guilds and sacristans, musicians and assisting ministers, ushers, and office staff. Instill in them awe and joy, that their service may reflect the love of Jesus. God, in your mercy,

C: receive our prayer.

P: We give thanks to you for our beloved dead, especially Fay Black, Dorothy Gochenauer, and Suzie Taylor, trusting that as the cross of Jesus led to the empty tomb, so you welcome those who have died into the paradise of your presence. God, in your mercy,

C: receive our prayer.

P: Receive the prayers of your people and draw all things together in your love, in the name of Jesus, who leads us from death to life.


THE DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you.


