





FIRST READING:

Acts 16:16-34

The First Reading is from Acts, the sixteenth chapter.

¹⁶One day, as we were going to the place of prayer, we met a slave-girl who had a spirit of divination and brought her owners a great deal of money by fortune-telling. ¹⁷While she followed Paul and us, she would cry out, "These men are slaves of the Most High God, who proclaim to you a way of salvation." ¹⁸She kept doing this for many days. But Paul, very much annoyed, turned and said to the spirit, "I order you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her." And it came out that very hour.

¹⁹But when her owners saw that their hope of making money was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace before the authorities. ²⁰When they had brought them before the magistrates, they said, "These men are disturbing our city; they are Jews ²¹and are advocating customs that are not lawful for us as Romans to adopt or observe." ²²The crowd joined in attacking them, and the magistrates had them stripped of their clothing and ordered them to be beaten with rods. ²³After they had given them a severe flogging, they threw them into prison and ordered the jailer to keep them securely. ²⁴Following these instructions, he put them in the innermost cell and fastened their feet in the stocks.

²⁵About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to

God, and the prisoners were listening to them. ²⁶Suddenly there was an earthquake, so violent that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were unfastened. ²⁷When the jailer woke up and saw the prison doors wide open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, since he supposed that the prisoners had escaped. ²⁸But Paul shouted in a loud voice, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here." ²⁹The jailer called for lights, and rushing in, he fell down trembling before Paul and Silas. ³⁰Then he brought them outside and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" ³¹They answered, "Believe on the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." ³²They spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house. ³³At the same hour of the night he took them and washed their wounds; then he and his entire family were baptized without delay. ³⁴He brought them up into the house and set food before them; and he and his entire household rejoiced that he had become a believer in God.

²⁰The one who testifies to these things says, "Surely I am coming soon." Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!




THE DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION



Also, we will be collecting items for these **Lutheran World Relief School Kits.** The kits are sent to students throughout the world who do not have access to basic school supplies. You will find the list below of specific school supplies needed to fill the kits. We cannot use items that do not comply with LWR's strict specifications. We especially need notebooks and drawstring bags. Please consider donating to this worthwhile cause. Your donations may be given to Pastor Susan.

If you would like to donate items for the school kits, see the details below of each item. We are also accepting monetary donations for postage and to purchase other supplies as needed to include in the kits. **Please Note:** Items donated should <u>not</u> reflect religious, patriotic, or military symbols, to include camouflage, and <u>also note</u> all other specifications.

Items you may donate:

- 70-sheet college or wide-ruled notebooks
- 30-centimeter rulers (or ruler with centimeters and inches)
- pencil sharpeners
- pairs of blunt scissors (safety scissors/steel blades)
- unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers
- black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink)
- boxes of 16-count or 24-count crayons
- 2½" erasers
- sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bags (approx. 14" x 17" with shoulder straps NO standard backpacks)
