

The festival of All Saints occurs just as the landscape in the Northern Hemisphere heralds the dying of plants and the quiet of winter rest. In like manner, the readings and liturgy of this day call us to rejoice in all the saints: those who have died and now rest in Christ, those who live now, and those yet to come.

As the church year draws to a close, we hear warnings about the end of time, stories of crisis and judgment, and parables of loss and death. The Christian community speaks honestly about human frailty and mortality. At the same time, we confess our faith in the risen Lord, in the communion of saints, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. While both life and death may bring us fear and uncertainty, the liturgy calls us to hear the Lord's promise that he is with us in life and in death. Christ has claimed us in baptism and nourishes us in the communion of his body and blood. Christ leads us to the new Jerusalem. There we shall join all the saints in praise of God, who has turned our graves into the doorway to eternal life.







NOTICE OF CONGREGATIONAL MEETINGS

Congregational meetings will be held at all three churches following services on **Sunday, December 11, 2022.**

The purpose of the meeting will be to amend the Plan of Operation for the Bendersville Lutheran Parish, Article V, JOINT COUNCIL OFFICERS, Paragraph 1.

Last November our Joint Council Treasurer, Cindy Baugher, advised us that she would be retiring from her position at the end of 2022. We put out a call for volunteers and have not received any responses. The bills must still be paid and the payroll met. Unfortunately, the Plan of Operation for the Parish clearly specifies that the position of Joint Council Treasurer may only be filled by a Parish member in good standing. At the November 1 meeting of the Joint Council, the proposed amendment was presented in writing and moved that we amend the Plan of Operation so that the Joint Council Treasurer position may be held by someone outside of the parish community (the Joint Council vote to approve the amendment cannot take place until 30 days after the presentation of the written proposal). This obviously means that we need the authority to hire someone or a service to carry out the bookkeeping/accounting functions of the Parish. A Finance Committee would be appointed by the Joint Council to oversee the Treasurer. On December 5, 2022, in accordance with the Plan of Operation, the Joint Council will vote to approve the amendment. Should it be approved, a congregational vote at all three churches is required for final approval. You will be sent via email or regular mail a copy of Article V, Paragraph 1, as it currently stands and also with the proposed change. Please plan on attending on December 11.
