

COVID UPDATE

The COVID Task Force, Bettina McBeth, Chris Cuttitta, Julie Haller (unable to attend), and Vicar Mike Faust, met on June 22, 2021 and agreed to lift all COVID related restrictions on June 28, 2021.

- 1. Masks are optional for anyone who feels they need to wear one. It is being suggested that unvaccinated youth under 12 wear a mask.
- 2. There currently is no social distancing requirement, but please respect each other's space.
- 3. We will not physically pass the peace at this time. It can be done by waving or gesturing during the service.
- 4. We suggest that the offering plates not be passed but put in a designated spot as we are doing at the present time.
- 5. At this time we will still have hymns in the bulletin. Each parish may return any items to pews as they see fit.
- 6. All will receive communion with the same wafer and juice cups until they are gone. At that point, each parish can decide how they would prefer to distribute the elements. We recommend against intinction as a method.
- 7. Attendance does not need to be done at this time for COVID reporting. If anyone should receive a positive test for COVID, out of respect for others, please report it to the task force.
- 8. Buildings can be used for purposes designated by each parish.

As always, if you feel sick stay home and watch service online.





Do I not fill heaven and earth? says the LORD. ²⁵I have heard what the prophets have said who prophesy lies in my name, saying, "I have dreamed, I have dreamed!" ²⁶How long? Will the hearts of the prophets ever turn back—those who prophesy lies, and who prophesy the deceit of their own heart?

²⁷They plan to make my people forget my name by their dreams that they tell one another, just as their ancestors forgot my name for Baal. ²⁸Let the prophet who has a dream tell the dream, but let the one who has my word speak my word faithfully. What has straw in common with wheat? says the LORD. ²⁹Is not my word like fire, says the LORD, and like a hammer that breaks a rock in pieces?


³²And what more should I say? For time would fail me to tell of Gideon, Barak, Samson, Jephthah, of David and Samuel and the prophets—³³who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, obtained promises, shut the mouths of lions, ³⁴quenched raging fire, escaped the edge of the sword, won strength out of weakness, became mighty in war, put foreign armies to flight. ³⁵Women received their dead by resurrection. Others were tortured, refusing to accept release, in order to obtain a better resurrection. ³⁶Others suffered mocking and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment. ³⁷They were stoned to death, they were sawn in two, they were killed by the sword; they went about in skins of sheep and goats, destitute, persecuted, tormented—³⁸of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, and in caves and holes in the ground.

³⁹Yet all these, though they were commended for their faith, did not receive what was promised, ⁴⁰since God had provided something better so that they would not, apart from us, be made perfect.

^{12:1}Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, ²looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith, who for the sake of the joy that was set before him endured the cross, disregarding its shame, and has taken his seat at the right hand of the throne of God.






